Ozark, Alabama, August 19, 1916.

The State Pension Commission,

Montgomery, Ala.

Gentlemen:-

I am writing you in the interest of Mrs. Sena^A Woodham whose application for reinstatement upon the pension roll is enclosed herewith.

There were two Mrs. Woodhams on the pension roll in this county, Mrs Sarah A. Woodham and the present applicant, who was on the roll as "Mrs S. A. Woodham". Mrs Sarah A. Woodham died in 1914 and not long after she had been placed on the roll. After her death her warrant kept coming and both warrants were sent to Pinckard where Mrs S. A. Woodham resided, and were sent under the impression that both the Mrs Woodhams lived there. Mrs S. A. Woodham, being the only one there, got both the warrants. This she did for three quarters, thereby drawing double warrants for that time.

When the law was so changed that reclassification blanks had to be sent out to the widows who were on the roll I sent one to Mrs S. A. Woodham and she filled it out and mailed it to me. A few days thereafter, thinking that the other Mrs. Woodham, that is Mrs Sarah A. Woodham, resided at Pinckard I sent a blank to her, which Mrs S. A. Woodham got also, and thinking that the first blank she had mailed me miscarried she filled out the second one and returned to me and both being identically the same revealed the fact that she was drawing doubly. Immediately upon being informed that she had been dropped from the roll by the State Auditor I sent my chief clerk to see her. He first asked her if she had ever made two applications to be placed upon the pension roll, and she replied that she had not. He then asked her if she had been getting two warrants for the same quarter and she replied very readily that she had. He then asked her how she accounted for the two warrants being sent to her. She said she did not know, but that she was sure there was some mistake somewhere, and believing that it would be located, she kept the warrant for four or five weeks expecting it to be recalled. You know that various and sundry reports get out about pension warrants and when the next warrant was sent her doubly she having heard that the warrants were going to be increased thought that maybe that was the way the increase was being paid. This old lady did nothing purposely wrong in this matter and was not altogether to blame.

I hope you will reinstate her as she is now getting old and very feeble and needy and has already missed two warrants more than she drew doubly.
