VIRGINIA COLONIAL RECORDS

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY, VIRGINIA

1656

The right to 50 acres of land was granted to anyone who would pay the transportation costs for bringing one person from England to the colonies as a settler. To repay the cost of ship passage, a person brought to America usually became an "indentured" servant for a certain period of years.

WOODHAM, THOMAS

John Chandler was granted a patent for 1,500 acres of land in Northumberland County, Virginia "upon certain branches of Wicocomico & Chichacone to Morraticon." ...for the transportation of 30 persons; including THOMAS WOODHAM. (one edition of these records gives the name as NICH WOODHAM) Patent granted 28 Jan., 1656 and renewed 11 Jan., 1663.

WOODHAM, EDWARD 1748

EDWARD WOODHAM witnessed a deed, 6 April, 1748 in Granville County, N. C., in which John Rackley sold 250 acres of land for \$15 to James McCattens (of Edgewcombe Co.). Wit.: Edward Collins & EDWARD WOODHAM.

WOODHAM 1756

(Edward ?) WOODHAM's land in Granville Co. is mentioned in a deed by Joseph Bridges to James Wilson, 6 Dec., 1756. The land adjoined WOODHAM'S and Cook's lines in Granville Co. on Tar River.

JOHNSTON COUNTY (area later became Dobbs Co.)

WOODHAM, EDWARD (Senior) 1757

EDWARD WOODHAM entered a survey plat for 104 acres of land in his request for a land grant. The land was "...in the fork of falling Creek joining Lovick Young's land..." in that part of Johnston County which later became Dobbs County and thereafter, Lenoir County. The survey is dated 2 Sept., 1757.

EDWARD WOODHAM recieved his land grant for the above described 104 acres in Johnston Co. on 10 April, 1761.

DOBBS COUNTY

WOODHAM, EDWARD JUNIOR 1764

EDWARD WOODHAM JR. entered a land survey plat for 238 acres in Dobbs County (that part which later became Lenoir Co.), "...on the east Side of Bear Creek Joyning Philip Stones and Nathan Walters Line...". 6 June, 1764.

EDWARD WOODHAM (JR.) recieved a land grant for the 238 acres described above on 26 Sept., 1766.

WOODHAM, EDWARD (Senior) 1767

EDWARD WOODHAM entered claim for a land grant survey of 440 acres (in that part of Dobbs County which later became Lenoir County), 10 Aug., 1767. The land was "...between Bair Creek & lower falling Creek,..." adjoining Phillip Stone, John Hanks and his own line.

EDWARD WOODHAM (Junior) recieved a land grant for the 440 acres described above, 22 Dec., 1768.

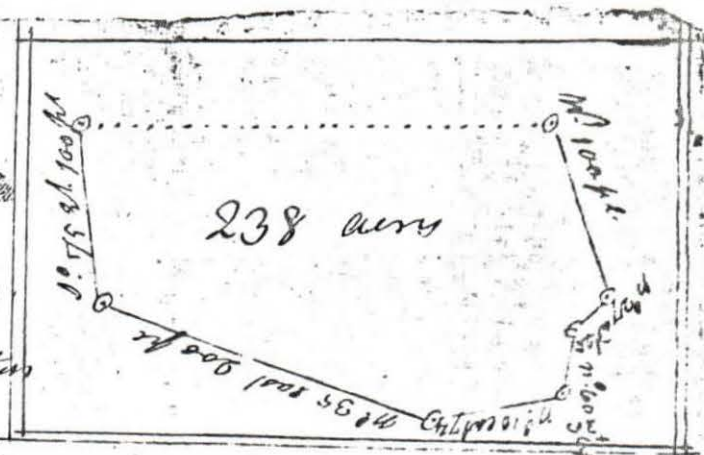

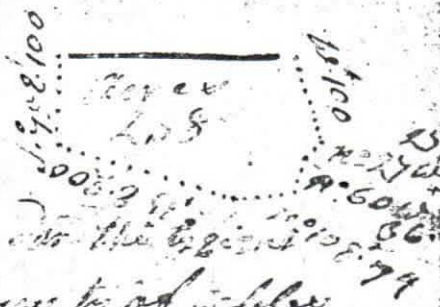

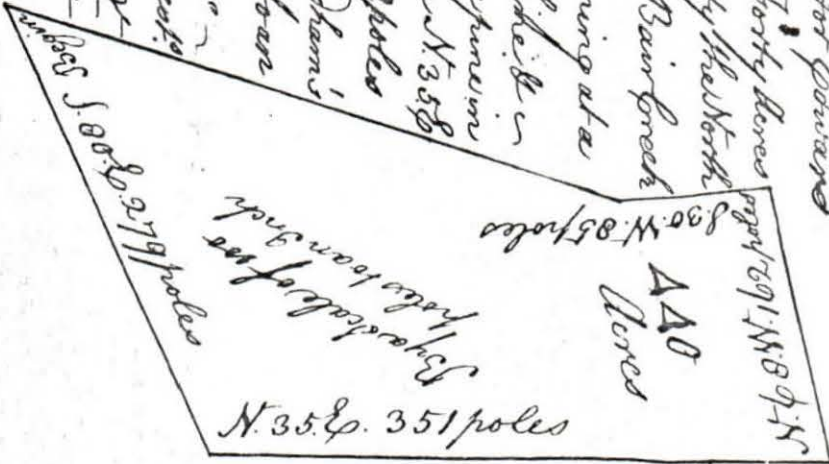

ELEANOR WOODHAM, Adtrix. to Lem^l Hardee"

"Adtrix." is the abbreviation for "administratrix", a female administrator of an estate of a deceased person. ELEANOR WOODHAM, the widow of EDWARD WOODHAM, SENIOR, was apparently named administratrix of his estate and sold certain land of the estate to Lemuel Hardee. The deed was registered during the January Term of Court, 1786, in Dobbs County, N. C.

Know all men by these presents that I Edward Woodham of Darlington County in the State aforesaid planter in consideration of Five pounds sterling Money paid by John Elexander of the county and state aforesaid planter have Granted Bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant Bargain sell & Release unto the said John Elexander one hundred acres of land be it more or less it being half of a certain tract of land containing two hundred acres divided by a line of Marked Trees binding on one side of land laid out to Micah Mixon Senior and on another side on land laid out to Micah Mixon Jun^r and hath such marks butings boundings as one half the platt annexed unto the Original Grant will make appear situate in Craven County so called when run out on the north side of Linches creek in Cheraw district which said land was granted unto James Wilson the 27th day January anno Domini 1773 Together with all & singular the Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incidend or appertaining to have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Elexander his Heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Ex^s and administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singular the said Premises unto the said John Alexander his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs & against every person whosoever Lawfully claiming or to claim the saim or any Part thereof Witness my hand and seal this Fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety seven & in the Twenty Second year of the independence of the United States of America Signed sealed & delivered in presence of us

Know all men by these Presents that I Edward Woodham of Sumter District and State aforesaid (planter) for and in consideration of three hundred & fifty dollars

(152) acres more or less lying & being on the No East side of Lynches Creek in Darlington District it being part of a certain tract of land containing four hundred & fifty acres which was granted to Thomas Hardyman the eleventh day of August Seventeen hundred and seventy four and recorded in the Secretarys office in Book RRR and Page 596 which part to be taken off the south east part of the said tract being the lower part of the said tract of land including a Griss Mill on the Spring Branch so called to the high water mark of the same Joining Hornes land and hath such shapes & form as part of the Original plat will make appear. To Have & to Hold all & singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said Aris Woodham his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs (etc.)

In the second place. I give unto my Son Athanus Woodham, one tract land whereon he now lives containing one hundred and sixty eight acres.

In the third place, I give unto my son Edward Woodham one tract of land whereon he now lives containing one hundred and sixty eight acres-

In the fourth place, I give unto my Son Ariss Woodham one bay mare, one featherbed and furniture, one cow and calf and bridle and saddle. Also that the negroe man Jess Shall be hired out the January after my decease, and the money arising from his hire to be given to my son Ariss, untill he recieves a proportionate with my sons Athanus, and Edward- then said negroe to be sold by my Exors and the monies arising from the sale to be divided between my young children, untill they recieve that part that I shall hezeafter state.

In the fifth place - I give unto my Daughter Margaret Woodham one Mare bridle, & Saddle, one cow and calf and one bed and furniture.

In the Sixth place, I Give unto Daughtër Feriba Woodham- one horse bridle and Saddle, one cow and calf, and one bed and furniture.

In the seventh place, I Give unto my Daughter Rachel Woodham one horse bridle and saddle- cow and calf and one bed and furniture.

In the eighth place, I give unto my Daughter Louisa Woodham one horse bridle and saddle one cow and calf and one bed and furniture.



Sons HENRY recieved one bounty of land "above Greensborough" and a negro slave; WILLIAM recieved 200 acres and one negro slave; EDMOND recieved 200 acres and one negro slave; and JAMES KELLY GARRETT recieved 200 acres and one negro slave.

Executors of the estate were his wife and friends Edmund Butler, Sen., Jonadas Reid, Joseph Barksdale.
