## INTRODUCTION

The Will and Deed Book of Charles City County, Virginia abstracted here was carried off from the courthouse during the Civil War. It remained in private hands, out of state, until the early 1970's when it was returned to Virginia. Charles City County, due to its losses in the Civil War has many gaps in its records. This book will help fill in the blanks that exist for many families that originated in this important county. Of particular interest are the references to families of James City and New Kent Counties, both burned counties.

During the period 1725-1731 Littlebury Epes was Clerk of the Court, followed by Lewellin Epes. Samuel Harwood and John Stith represented the county in the House of Burgesses in 1726, but information is not available for the rest of this period.

The first seven pages in the book are missing. A number of the deeds were recorded twice, as deeds of bargain and sale, and as deeds of lease and release. Since they contain almost identical information, only one was abstracted. In the former the price is given as 5 shillings usually. In the latter the true price is given. The two deeds were usually recorded one day apart.

Since court clerks often spelled names phonetically, several spellings of the same surname may exist in these documents. The same holds true to a lesser extent for given names. This book is intended as a guide and may be subject to error. Please refer to the original for exact documentation.



First I give devise and bequeath to my grandson John Woodham all my estate both real and personal except my wearing apparel to be sold by auction for money to be paid in twelve months next --- the day of sale and the money when paid to remain in the hand of executor herein after mentioned till my said grandson arrives at the age of twenty one years and if my said grandson shall die before he attains to the said age of twenty one years or without heirs lawfully begotten then the money arising from the sale of my estate before mentioned shall be equally divided between the children then living of my daughter Susannah Gill.

Secondly I will and desire that all my wearing apparel should be equally divided between my two daughters **Eleanor Woodham** and Susannah Gill and also I give to each of them one milled crown.

Lastly I desire that my estate may not be appraised and that my executor hereafter named pay all my just debts and funeral expenses and I do appoint --- John Bolling sole executor of this my last will and Testament and that he my

said executor do bound out my grandson **John Woodham** to a trade such as he the said John Woodham shall approve of. Hereby revoking all other will by me heretofore made uttered by word or in writing ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.
