Dear Cousin, I was happy to receive your letter as I have often wondered what became of William Watkins Jumage's little boys First I think I should introduce myself. I and the great grandson of Jucretia ann Watkins and Benjamin Franklin Awayze. Lucretia ann was the sister of Clarissa Thomas Watkins Jumage, Crawford, I am a 4th cousin of Willie, allen, Luther and Ernest through the Watkins line. Sam over 72 years of age. My wife Rubie and I have been married over 51 years. We have one child, Latricia June (nee Swayse) Larsen, two grandchildren, James Phillip Larsen and Mrs. Lynn Katherine (needarsen) Johnston & and one great grandson, Erik Swayze Larren. My daughter Patricia (Pat) and husband Phillip Relson Larsen live in Fairfax, Virgenia. He is a retired air Force General and Command

pilot. He to a PhD in Electrical Engineering and an M.S. in Suseness administration My daughter has a Masters degree in Political Science My great grand parents, Benjamin Franklin Swayze and Lucretia Unn Watkins died near alemivell, In in the early 1870s leaving six children, four of whom were minors, These children moved to Drenham Jepan about 1876 and through the years family connections with kin in Messissippi and Louisiana were forgatten as that generation deedout. Until 1977 all that I knew of my family was that they once leved near Harrisonburg. La When I was a baby, my grandfather Swayge left a large coffee can filled with letters at my maternal grandparents, Undrew J. and Nelen Urban. Through the years these letters had no meaning to me as I ded not know the ones who wrote them. among these letters were several from Clunt Clara Erawford (alimivell La) to my grandparents, Freston Edwin and Mary Virginia (nee Staham) Swayze who were

living in Elgin, Jerae. I am sending you one of the letters from aunt Clara telling of Watkins death and of his four little boys; one only 3 weeks old being sent to an orphans home. I believe you can feel just how saddened and upset aunt blass was. I think this letter would have let the four Jumage brothers just how much their grandmather cared for them. Some of those mentioned in this letter are Bennie (Benjamin Zachariah) son of James William and Mancy D. (new Watkins) Swayse Thelip and Channie (sons of aunt blava by John L. Crawford) anna (Bennie Swayze's wife Anna Dixon Swayze) allen's wife (Mary ann Smith D. 240pr. 1815 d. 10 Dec. 1967) allen James Swayze was the son of James Arthur Swayzefa first cousin of William Watkins Surnage. Sester Amanda (Amanda Maliena Watkins, wife of Ford Halmes and sister of aunt 6 lara) I have no idea who Lovie or Mr. Deasley (OVER)

Owere, Swonder of William Watkins Surnegie wife Cordelea agnes Smith was a sister of mary ann Amith who married allen James Swayze after whom your husband was named. Mary ann was born 24 april 1875 and died 10 Dec. 1961. Cordelia aque was born Jan 11, 1874 and died 5 nov. 1937. It is possible allen James and Mary Upn Swayze were uncle and Cunt of the four Turnage boys. I really do not know much about the Jurnages as an connected with the family through the Watkins. In fact I knew nothing of the family until I found Owille and Hagel Crawford who were levering in Harrisonburg. They were the ones who told me Watkins was a Sumage I do not know when Egra Manuel Jumay died I know he was alive 21 Oct 1868 as he signed an oath (for the Yankees) that he had never been desenfranchised. This oath is on record at the Catahoula Parish Courthouse. He died before aug. 14, 1872 the date aunt Clara married John L. Crawford.

I have not researched the Jurnage family Tree. When Egra and Clarissa (Clara, Clarat) married in Vidalia, La, there was a piece in the newspaper stating that Egra was from Memphis. I have information he was born 10 October 1825 in LittCounty, M. Caroling. Shrough Clasissa Thomas Watteins, your husband descended from the Watkins Sanders Joungs, Mc Cluskens, Doves, Gunnells and others. I am trying to record the information I have so that I can pase this data on to you. I will also send the information to Mrs. William J. Jurnage (Jel No. 661-5790) Kt. 2, Box 157 Ellsworth, Maine 04605 The Gunnelle lived near the Great Falle of the Patomac in Vergenia and George Washington was a frequent visitor in their home. I am still working as the Walken lineage which is going to take a little time to prepare. 

James Bell was the son of John Bell Jr. of Albemarle Parish, Surry Co., Va. and wife Hannah. John died May 25, 1746 (APR) Their children: John m. Burkitt and Read's HISTORY OF THE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION (1802) gives a brief biography of James Bell -

"Elder James Bell was born in Sussex county, Virginia, of parents who profesed the Episcopal religion, but there was no great reason to believe they were acquainted with an experience of grace. He, as his parents before him had done, frequently attended the church of England, and complied with the forms of the church. He as a man of bright intellectuals, and at a very early period became popular in the county where he lived. He first received a commission in the military department; he was appointed Captain of a militia company; then a Justice of the Peace; and some time after became Sheriff of the county. His popularity increasing, he gained the general esteem of every respectable character in Sussex, and the adjacent counties. He was at length solicited to offer himself a candidate for the General Assembly, and accordingly did, and was elected by a large majority, and continued to represent that county for some time. Inot true--served as burgess only 1770-711 All the time he was anxiously pursuing popularity he had no concern about religion, nor anxiety for the salvation of his soul, until his brother Benjamin Bell, who had for some time been removed to the south, came in to see him. His brother Benjamin was converted, and had joined the Baptists in the south state, and when he came into Virginia and saw his brother James Bell, he told him what the Lord had done for his soul, and what a miserable state he apprehended his brother to be in; insomuch that it took a very powerful effect on his brother, so that he never was truly satisfied until he had reason to hope the Lord had converted his soul. And he was then willing to part with all his worldly honour and preferments for that nonour that comes from God only. He was baptised in Sussex county, by Elder John Meglamre, in the year of 1770, and soon after became a zealous preacher of the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ; and it is well known he always continued a remarkable pious and zealous christian until his death. He became a member, and then took care of the church on Sappony, in Sussex county, Virginia, which was formerly under the care of Elder John Rivers, and continued preaching and baptizing until September, 1778, when he died. In his last sickness, he said, he was apprehensive he should not be in his senses when he died. He therefore wished to have his children called together, that he might talk to them while he had the exercise of his reason. Which was accordingly done, and all his children, who were present, stood around him, and he very affectionately exhorted them all before he bid the world adieu! He requested Elder Burkitt (who was present) to preach his funeral sermon from i. Tim. i. 15. 'This is a raithful saying; and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief.' It is this, said he, upon which my soul depends for life and salvation. He departed this life, September, 1778, aged about 43 years."

Evidently Balaam, the middle son, aged 13 when his father died, and who did not inherit any of James's land in Virginia, migrated south to Pitt County. Could these 1812 Pitt County militiamen have been his sons? -- Burwell Bell, James Bell, Benjamin Bell.

Some other members of this Surry-Sussex Co. Bell family settled in the Wake Co., North Carolina, area.

Thomas Phillip Turnage. (most often referred to as " Phillip ") was born in Warren County, Kentucky in 1825. He was the son of James Phillip and Elizabeth (Donihoo) Turnage.

As a young young man, Phillip was 5" 10 1/2" tall with light hair, fair complexion and blue eyes.

Phillip enrolled in the Union Army during the confrontation of " The War Between The States" (Civil War 1861-1865). He was mustered into service on November 5, 1862 at Camp Butler (Springfield) Illinois. He was assigned to Company "G", 128th Regiment, Illinois Infantry Volunteers and attained the rank of corporal. Other members of his family in this unit were his brothers, Andrew Jackson, Reuben P. W., Henry L. Turnage and his brother-in-law, George B. Chamness.

Phillip Turnage married Agnes Mahala Grey on 16 September 1865 in Williamson County, Illinois. The union of Phillip and Agnes brought forth the following children:

Thomas Phillip Turnage, Jr. born 1872 in Williamson County, Illinois. Charles W. Turnage, born 1874 in Williamson County, Illinois. (Charles died at the age of 7 years of scarlet fever.)

The other children of Phillip and Agnes brought to their marriage from each of their first marriages and are in their household in the 1870 U. S. Census of Williamson County, Illinois were;

Elizabeth, born 1852 Ebry (female), born 1857 William, born 1860 Julia, born 1863

These children could have been by Agnes' first husband, Ike Grey.

Phillip Turnage was a strict father to his children according to stories told to his granddaughter, Ruth (Turnage) Stephens.

In 1867, Fhillip Turnage was living in Township 10, Range 2, in school district 2 of Williamson County, Illinois and paid person property taxes of \$1.46 in state tax, \$1.47 in county taxes and \$2.94 in school taxes on \$147.00 worth of property valued at \$190.00.

He also paid \$1.99 in state taxes, \$2.00 in county taxes, \$3.20 in school taxes on 80 acres of property in Section 7 of Wiilliamson County, Illinois valued at \$2.00 per acre.

(The two aformentioned paragraphs are referenced on pages 43 and 194 of taxes for that period in Williamson County, Illinois.)

Phillip Turnage is listed as Phillip Turnage in the 1870 U.S. Census of Williamson County, Illinois in Township 10, Range 2, with a post office address of Pulley's Mill, page 32, lines 31 through 36 inclusive, dwelling #229, family #229.

Phillip was a farmer of substantial wealth. His land was valued at \$500.00. Non-family members in the aforementioned paragraph were John Bell, age 15, a farmer labor, 2 girls, and a 10 year old boy. Notes from:

Fhillip Turnage is also in the 1880 U. S. Census of Williamson County, Illinois, Southern Precinct, line 18 through 23 inclusive, dwelling # 215 and family # 215, Ida Crigg (Craig) born 1862 is listed as daughter and Milinda Crigg, born 1880. is listed as a granddaughter are also in this household. They lived 5 farms away from Phillip's brother, Reuben P. W. Turnage.

Phillip Turnage died 5 October 1883 at the age of 58 years, 7 months and 20 days. He died of congestion of the brain caused by typhoid fever. He was buried at Old Crab Orchard Church in Williamson County, Illinois on 6 October 1883.

After his death, Agnes filed a formal petition for guardianship in Williamson County, Illinois Circuit Court for her son James ("Jimmie") Turnage on 19 May 1884.

Agnes Mahala (Grey) Turnage probably died sometime after 1884 and is probably buried in Williamson County, Illinois.

The information contained in the following seven pages is almost all WRONG!

Most of this information is taken directly from the book "The Trail Blazers", written in 1935 by Alice Turnidge Hamot.

Do NOT use this as a source for information since you would be using incorrect facts.

The name Turnage had its origin in England, anglicised Turnidge, Turneege, Turnage, Turnege, Turnedge, Turnich. The name first appeared about the twelth century. Surnames in English came into use in England about the eleventh century. Families derived their surname from their occupation. The first Turnages were turners of wood and lath makers. The name appears frequently in the old marriage bonds and other parish records in England, baptisms, births, etc.*

The oldest record of the Turnages I found in my research is contained in the will of one Jane Bromley of Orsted, Essex, county England, dated June 26, 1315. The will was proved July 13, 1614, and mention is made of "my grandchild Jane Turnedge". Also, one John Turnedge was willed 40 shillings by Sir Edward Pinton, Knights of Writtle, Essex. Mention is also made of William and Mary Turnedge. This will was dated March 5, 1626, proved May 8, 1627. William and Mary Turnedge moved to Scotland in the 17th century and their son William later settled in North Ireland.

Although it is not known for certain, it is thought that the Turnages migrated to Ireland in the 1660's. <u>Many Americans who consi</u>der themselves Scotch-Irish are actually descendants of English settlers who migrated to Ulster and there became members of communities where the Scottish influence was predominant. These English came to Ulster beginning in 1660 to escape the "killing times" of the Covenanting Troubles. When movement to America began about 1717, many of these English Ulstermen joined their Scottish friends and neighbors in their removal to the new world.

Whether from Scotland or Ireland (and the elders of the family have always told me we were Scotch-Irish), George Turnidge migrated to North Carolina (precinct of Chowan, now Columbus County, N. C.) in 1714. George was the brother of William Turnidge, who as previously mentioned, had removed to Scotland from England. He was either accompanied, or joined later, by his brother James. George and James Turnidge moved to New Bern, North Carolina, in 1753. By this time William Turnidge was in North Carolina, at Edenton. George Turnidge served as a member of a grand jury in the precinct of Chowan during the summer of 1717. A record of one case brought before this grand jury on July 24, 1717, is still in existence in the North Carolina Archives. In this same year George Turnidge was granted the sum of ten dollars in a damage suit. In 1719 he served as juror in a felony case. ("Colonial Records", Vol. 25.)

George Turnidge settled on land in Pasquatank County on Indian Creek. He was a planter, and his home was known as "Indian Creek Plantation". He entered the land in 1714 and sold it to one John Ward in 1748.

William Turnidge entered land in 1714 adjoining that of George Turnidge. Prior to this, William had owned land in Chowan County, entered the same year.

From the years 1717-1728, Lazerous, Abraham, Jacob, and Turner Turnidge were soldiers in the King's Army. They received pay in the amount of 186.11.3 from William Faircloth, officer in the King's Army.

The oldest will Mrs. Hamot was able to find in the Archives in North Carolina, the Copeland will, written October 23, 1720, was witnessed by George and Elizabeth Turnidge.

The Turnidges migrated from Pasquatank (Chowan Precinct) to <u>Craven</u>, Green, and Pitt Counties (then Dobbs County). They had first settled at New Bern, later in Green. The site of the oldest Turnage plantation is located in Pitt County, N. C., between Greenville and Wilson. Many Turnages are buried there. One of the old Turnage homes was at Scupaliton (location unknown by me). It belonged to Joseph Turnage and later to his son, Elias. When the counties were divided, some of those residing in Green County found their land was now in Pitt County. It was said that Joseph and his brother, William Turnidge, at one time owned more than half of Green County.

On December 21, 1763, James Turnage deeded approximately one hundred acres of land in Pitt County to WILLIAM TURNAGE. Note that by this time our branch of the family had begun to spell the family name as we do today.

In October of 1771 George Turnidge deeded land to Thomas Turnidge in Pitt County. This land, about 150 acres, was situated on the north side of the Neuse River. The deed was witnessed by William Turnidge, Jr., and Selah Turnidge.

The following are said to have been sons of William and Selah Turnage:

Luke Turnidge

Amos Turnidga - Migrated to Mississippi. He died there.

Isaac Turnidge - Migrated to Alabama where he had a large plantation in Coffee County. Isaac died in Alabama.

Zecheriah, Daniel, Jessie, James, Thomas Keder, Cader, Argent, Briant, William, Joseph, John, Thomas, Elias.

In all, William Turnage was the father of 22 children, all of whom lived to be grown.

William Turnage was married twice. His first wife was named Selah and his second wife Elizabeth. It is not known which of the children are the issue of which union, except William Turnage, Jr. William, Jr., was the child of William and Elizabeth Turnage. This is borne out by a deed dated October 20, 1795, and which is as follows:

DEED - WILLIAM TURNAGE, SR., to His Son, WILLIAM TURNAGE, JR.

This indenture was made the 20th of October, 1795.

Know Ye, that I William Turnage Senior, of Pitt County of the One Part and William Turnage, Junior, his Son, the other Part. Where of I the said William Turnage, Sr., as well for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which he hath unto the said William Turnage, Junior, his Son, as also for the better maintainence and preferment on the said William Turnage, Junior, hath given, granted, alined, and confirmed and by these presents do give, grant, aline, and confirm, unto the said William Turnage, Junior, all my land and plantation whereon I dwell, at my death. Together with all the improvements thereon, and all my Stock, Horses, Cattle and Hogs, and all my house furniture, and all I possess at my Death he the said William Turnage, Junior, supporting his Mother Elizabeth Turnage and maintaining her so long as she lives in a decent manner; to Have and hold the said lands and plantation and premises hereby given and granted unto the said William Turnage, Junior, his Heirs and assigns forever and the same William Turnage, Senior, for himself, his Heirs, Executors and administrators, doth covenent and Grant to and with the said William Turnage, Junior, his heirs and assigns shall and lawfully may after my Death hereafter peaceable and quietly have, hold, occupy, possess, and enjoy the said Land and plantation, Heridtaments, and premises hereby given and granted or mentioned or intended so to be with these appertenances free and clear and discharged of and from former and other gifts, grants, bargains and Sales, and from all other titles, troubles, charges, and incumberaces whatsoever.

Witness thereof I have set my hand and Seal the day and year above written.

In 1782 William Turnage entered land in Dobbs County, N. C.

William Turnage; Senior, migrated from North Carolina to South Carolina around 1780. The South Carolina Archives have the following records:

1782 - William Turnage had a horse and saddle impressed for Continental use in 1782 by Colonel Lee. Amount due 25 pounds sterling.

August 1.3, 1783 - William Turnage of Cheraw District swears he has not received payment for above. (S.C. Archives, Document AA 7943)

William Turnage was a member of the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War, probably a member of the South Carolina Line. We do not know a great deal about his service, but we do know he was captured by the British during the siege of Charleston (1780). He was paroled by the British, and his signature appears among those paroled in the "Yearbook, City of Charleston, 1897", page 406. In 1785 we have the first record of William Turnage entering land in South Carolina. On May 16, 1785, a survey was made for him for two hundred acres of land in the Cheraw District "on the southwest side of the Great Pee Dee and North side of Great Juniper on little Juniper Creek". On January 5, 1794, two separate two hundred acre tracts of land were recorded. Both of these tracts were on the waters of Juniper Creek. These plats are on file in the South Carolina Archives. It is very probable that these two tracts adjoined his initial tract. We know then, that by 1794 William Turnage had holdings of six hundred acres of land on Juniper Creek in Chesterfield County. As well as I can determine from consulting Mills Atlas of 1825 this land is now under the waters of the lake near Cheraw at Cheraw State Park.

We have two more references to William Turnage prior to the beginning of the 19th Century:

In the <u>History of the Old Cheraws</u> - <u>A.D. 1730</u> - <u>1810</u>, by the Right Reverend Alexander Gregg, D. D., Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Texas, and former rector of <u>St. David's Church (Epis-</u> copal), Cheraw, we find the following:

"Of the Turnages, who emigrated to what is now Chesterfield, William served his country faithfully. He died at an advanced age about 1823. A son, John Turnage, yet survives, a worthy citizen of Chesterfield."

The Federal Census of 1790 lists William Turnage and one other male at least 16 years of age, four males under 16 years of age, and three females. He owned no slaves at this time.

By 1820 there were five Turnage households in the Cheraw District. William Turnage, Junior, had removed from North Carolina to South Carolina, and the other heads of households were Luke, Richard, John, and William Turnage, Senior. Of special interest to us there is this issue of William Turnage, Senior

Of these children we are able to trace only John, the common ancestor of all the Turnages I have located in Chesterfield, Darlington, and Marlboro County. The main reason for this is that General Sherman burned the Chesterfield County Courthouse during the War Between the States. Hence, all the old records of Chesterfield County prior to 1860 were destroyed.

We do have one record of Richard Turnage from a ledger book of "Coker and Gregg, Merchants and Shippers", of Society Hill. This entry is dated January, 1827, and reads simply "Richard Turnage - discount for cash \$1.25."

To conclude this brief recounting of the early history of the Turnages I include excerpts from the Federal Census of 1850. This census is of particular importance because it was the first census to list by name each member of the household. As you can see from this list there are many Turnages we have lost track of, but fortunately we are still able to trace our line.

Dear Wynne,

I received your nice letter and the thick packet of papers enclosed with it. The packet of notes and letters was most interesting. I am still studying it; it will take me many months to sort it all out and enter the data in my system.

Yes, I am sure now that Isaac William Turnage was not my ancester. I have eliminated Isaac William Turnage, William A. Turnage, Sr. and William B. Turnage. I know that my great grandfather was named William Turnage, Jr. that he was born in Tennessee in 1837, married Phebe Lewis in Fayette County, Texas in 1859, had one son named William Lincoln Turnage in 1862 and died in the Civil War in 1864.

I am now proceeding on the theory that my great grandfather's middle initial was M. In his military record for the Civil War, all the transcript cards but one list him simply as "William Turnage"; on one card he is listed as "Wm. M. Turnage". If this is accurate, then all I have to do is find a man named William M. Turnage (Sr) who lived in Tennessee in 1837, who was old enough to be the father of my Wm. Jr. Actually, I have not spent much time on finding Wm. M. Sr. so far. I have been trying to discover just where and when Wm. Jr. died in the Civil war, and where he is buried. Family tradition says he died in June 1864 in battle "near the Mexican border". The answer may lie in the State Library in Austin or in some dusty graveyard in the Rio Grande valley.

Thank you for the new copy of Wm. George's admission to the bar. It is much better than the one I made in the State Library in 1987. The fact that William George Turnage came to Fayette County TX to be admitted to the bar does indeed suggest that he may have had some kind of family connection there. Since his mothers maiden name was Bell, he may have been related to Judge Bell, as you suspect. According to Robert Earl's book, Isaac W. Turnage (the father of William George) was the brother of Wm. B. Turnage, which would make Wm. B. the uncle of William George, and Wm. B. lived in Fayette County, Texas in the 1850's. That would have given William George another reason for travelling to Fayette County.

I have found no evidence in Fayette County TX that William A. Turnage, the son of Henry Turnage, even lived in that county. He was listed in the 1850 census of Tipton County TN in mid 1850 and he witnessed a document for his father in Tipton County in November 1850. Among the documents which you sent me is a letter from a Susan Collins to an Isaac Turnage (1851 Along the Cumberland

Tennessee) which says that Henry's son William was then in "the new state of Texas". William A. may have been in some other part of Texas, perhaps long the Trinity or Red rivers. Of course, he could have been in Fayette County TX without doing anything which would create a written record. On 13 FEB 1858 Wm. A. participated in a slave auction in Memphis. One of the mysteries of his life is that he does not appear in the 1860 census of Tennessee, although his family does. He apparently liked to travel about the frontier, leaving his family in the safety of the family farm in Tipton County.

From your letter, I gather that you are seeking proof of the father of Isaac William Turnage. Do you have a copy of Robert Earl's book, "Turnage Family History"? His book says that Isaac's father was named William Turnage (pp.69,72). That, of course, is not conclusive proof. Question is, where did he get this information? He suggests (p.69) that he got it from the estate records of Zachariah Turnage, who died in 1847. Robert Earl stated in a private letter to me that he believed that he had once had a copy of the estate records, but could not find it when he looked for it later. In 1987 I found some estate records for Zachariah Turnage in the office of the County Clerk in Fayette County TX but the records I found then did not include the Final Account of the Administrator, which names the heirs.

After receiving your letter, I concluded that the estate records Robert Earl used must be among the records in Fayette County, TX. After several months of letter writing, I finally got a copy of the Final Account in the Estate of Zachariah Turnage from the County Clerk. It names the Administrator as Wm. Β. Turnage and the heirs as Thomas Turnage, Wm. B. Turnage, Isaac W. Turnage, James Turnage, Beady Turnage, Gardner Turnage, Sandy M. Turnage, Geo. W. Turnage, Shel Turnage, Walker C. Turnage, and John C. Turnage. When Wm. ₿. Turnage petitioned for letters of administation, he represented that he was a brother of Zachariah Turnage. We have other evidence which identities Wm. B. and Walker as brothers of Shelby Turnage, Zachariah apparently died intestate, so his estate would have passed to his heirs at law. Laws vary from one jurisdiction to another, but under the general principles of common law, his brothers and sisters would have inherited no interest in the estate unless he left neither surviving children, spouse or parents. Therefore, it is logical to conclude that all of the named beins were brothers or sisters of Zachariah. The Final Account therefore confirms the list of children found on pp.72,73 of Robert Earl's book, with the exception of some guestions concerning Shelby Turnage. The list in the Probate Records lists a "Shel Turnage". The list in the Probate Minutes lists a "Shell Turnage". Wm. B. Turnage, the Administrator, represented that all the heirs except himself and Walker C. Turnage were "scattered over the different states of the union". Other evidence indicates that Shelby died in 1843, 4 years before the death of Zachariah and 13 years before the Final Account was filed. As far as I Know, Shelby resided in Texas from 1836 until his death in 1843. All of this suggests that the "scattered" statement was at least inaccurate.

The Final Account makes no mention of the parents of the 12 children, so I still do not know where Robert Earl got the information that their father was named William. That proof may exist in some of the other sources mentioned by Robert Earl. If we accept that the estate records of Zachariah prove that the 12 children were all siblings, then identifiation of the father of one of them is identification of the father of all of them. The gravestone of Wm. B. (in Fayette County TX) states that he was born in Chesterfield, SC in 1794. Census records show that Isaac W. Turnage was born in South Carolina in 1799. The

father Of Wm. B. and Isaac W. must be one of the Turnages who lived in Chesterfield, SC in the 1790's.

Yes, I do have a copy of "The Trailblazers". Someday, I will try to make sense out of it. It may give me a clue about my elusive ancestors.

While I did not find any clues about my ancestors among the documents you sent me, I did find some interesting tidbits about the family of William B. Turnage. The information about Elisha Turnage's desertion to Matamoras, Joseph Robinson's participation in the Dawson expedition, and Albert Hill's connection to the Dawson expedition will spice up my accounts of this family. Thank you very much.

The pursuit of my Turnage ancestors has been so frustrating that I have spent the past several months researching other lines. In four months researching the Sample line I have added more generations than I found in 8 years researching the Turnage line.

Many thanks for the volume of information you sent. I expect it will be useful many times in the future. It is not necessary to send me further information on the descendants of Isaac W. Turnage, as Cathy has already given me a ream of material on it. I am enclosing for your use copies of the estate records in the Estate of Zachariah Turnage, and a letter which states that William B., Walker C and Shelby C. Turnage were brothers. Maybe they will help you in proving the parentage of your ancestor, Isaac William Turnage.

May the Good Lord smile upon you.

which will interest you. It sheds some light on the Isaac W. Turnage and Patsy Bell marriage. It looked to be quite rocky. I will let you form your own conclusions.

Recorded December 17, 1833, pages 201-206.

"Patsy Turnage states that she intermarried with Isaac W. Turnage in the year 1817 as is now recollected and with the exception of seven years in Smith County, they have resided in Wilson County. The said Isaac W. Turnage is on the verge of abandoning his wife who is and has been for the last five years insane. John Bell is the father of said Patsy Turnage and cannot account for the mental derangement of his daughter or any other probable grounds than the unkind treatment of his daughter from some short time after their marriage. None of their family so far as he knows have ever become insane and he cannot reasonably suppose that her derangement is to be attributed to any other cause than unkind and unnatural treatment on his part. The said Isaac W. is an unkind and cruel man. Wilst their second child was a sucking infant, their eldest sickened and died. His neglect of the sick child and his conduct on that occasion was most unnatural. On the day his child died, he quarreled with his wife because his breakfast had not been prepared and ready for him at the ususal time. After his wife lay down the sick child and got something for him to eat, he returned to the barnyard to his work and the same day the child died He at his work manifesting but little concern for the distress of his wife on the death of the child. The said Isaac W. imposed hardships upon his wife such as getting her own firewood and making fires or doing without. The said Isaac W. has been threatening for some time past to leave his wife. He is now making preparation and is expected to leave the country in the course of two or three weeks. The said Isaac W. has recently made what he thinks is ample provision for his wife by conveyance to Benjamin T. Bell one half acre. The said John Bell, her father, is now old and infirm and barely able to support himself and his family. He is seeking alimony for his daughter."

Then...on May 5, 1834:

Patsy Turnage Vs. Isaac W. Turnage--Isaac Turnage has abandoned Patsy. The said Patsy is and has been for several years in a state of great mental derangement. Their marriage is dissolved.

I have a couple of questions for you, if you can answer them. First, do you know if Patsy really did follow Isaac to Tipton County and second, what is the source of her death date and place?

HISTORY OF OUR FAMILY Submitted by Marine TURNAGE

Each Newsletter will contain at least a page (or more as space permits) of the TURNAGE Family History. If you have anything to contribute, please send it to the President or Secretary at the addresses are on the last page of this Newsletter. Reference sources will be given at the completion of this history.

- TURNAGE: The name first appeared in England in the 12th Century. Later, Henry TURNIDGE and Ann ALEXANDER, both of West Madison, County of Essex, were married at St. Dionis Back Church, London in 1533. In 1663, Ann TURNIDGE married William WOOD.
- TURNAGE: From a turner, a lathmaker, a family of this name had possession of the estate or Ardwall in the Parish of New Abbey for generations. The name is found also in Aberdeen 1382-1426-1473-1511; and in Dysert.

The name probably came into England during the battle of Hastings in 1066 when William the Conqueror took England and, with his cohorts, beheaded Charles First. The Norman Conquerors declared the English King, Henry II, "Lord of Ireland" in 1171. Later in the 1500's and early 1600's, Hugh O'NEIL led the Irish chieftains in an unsuccessful rebellion against the English. And in 1649, Oliver CROMWELL confiscated nine tenths of Ireland and gave it to the English landlords. It was during these changing times that tradition says William TURNIDGE and his wife, Mary went to Scotland.

Old records show their son, William TURNIDGE II and his wife, Mary PLATT, in North Ireland where they were married April 27, 1646 in St. James Parish of Clarkiwald. That is the beginning of the line of TURNIDGES who came to America before 1714 with their families.

They had lived during the Jacobite uprising in 1680-90 when the English defeated the Irish at the Battle of Boyne. It was during these years that the TURNIDGES were manufacturers of wool, and dairying in Ireland.

Whether or not the TURNAGES were in Ireland before the mid-1600's is not known, but they are believed to have been Scotch Irish, migrating from Scotland to Ireland before that period of time.

The TURNIDGES were Protestant Christian's and some were persecuted. They grew tired of conflict and persecution, being literally pressured out of Ireland before 1714.

They must have garnered the family resources for they are shown on record in America owning lands in Chowan precinct in 1714.

They came to America as frontiersmen, seeking political and religious freedom. William III owned land and served as a juryman in his precinct in 1716. He later moved to Edenton, NC.

There were four TURNIDGE brothers who came from Ireland before 1714 settling in NC with their families: George, Joseph, James and William III. James and William III each had eight sons, all with Biblical names: Zachariah, Ezekial, Daniel, Moses, Elias, Amos,

Thomas, John, James, Luke, Joseph, Aaron, Enoch, Peter, Jessee, and Benjamin. James and William III were probably the oldest of the four brothers since they each had eight sons besides daughters in their families.

These four brothers came together and seemingly stayed together as shown by the early records.

The TURNIDGE brothers had other sons with Biblical names, for in 1717-1728, records show three TURNIDGE'S in the King's Army. A Lazerous, Jacob and Abraham TURNIDGE were paid by William Faircloth, paymaster.

In 1720, Elizabeth TURNIDGE, age 62 years, witnessed a will of William Copeland in Chowan precinct. She was the wife of William III from Ireland, later found in Dobbs County, NC. This county was later divided into four counties, Green County (first from Glasgow County), Pitt, Lanoir, and Duplin where many of the TURNIDGES settled very early, and still live in the same areas as did their ancestors.

The TURNIDGES began to migrate, always taking their families with them, using their resources wisely and keeping close contact with their kinsmen. They were alert and successful in securing many grants of land in this new country. In 1753-54, the TURNIDGES still owned lands in Edenton and New Bern, NC.

It was during this time, about 1727, that the name was first spelled "TURNAGE", through errors in state records on land grants, and so the change of the name in NC and SC.

James and George TURNAGE settled in Pasquotauk County, NC. George's land was on Indian Creek. His home was called "Indian Creek Plantation". He sold it in 1747.

The family migrated into other counties in NC, where records show Joseph TURNAGE owned land in Green County in 1771. Green County was Glasgow County at the time; it became Green County in 1799. Other TURNAGES owning lands were William and John in Anson County, 1779, and John and James in Tyrell County, 1782; Shared in 1866, Richard L., 1866.

Peter, Louis, Blaney and Enoch owned land in Duplin and Lenoir counties. Amos TURNAGE, son of William III, went to Mississippi. Isaac went to Coffee County, AL.

William IV, son of Zachariah, and his brother Joseph went to Green County, NC and it is said "they owned over half the land in the county at one time". George settled later in Pitt County, NC where he built a home. It is the oldest plantation home in the county today, and the site is marked near the old home. The TURNAGE Cemetery between Greenville and Wilson, NC on the bypass route on Farmville Highway 264 is marked by a stone monument to TURNAGEs in NC. The TURNAGEs still migrating and searching for a better living for their families, always left a few families behind with the old land marks.

In 1768, Hattie TURNAGE was in Green County; also John in 1778, Luke in 1780 and Isaac and Abraham in 1799.

The First Federal Census listed Daniel, James and Ezikeal in Duplin County, NC, 1790.

In 1777, George, Jacob and Turner were in Onslow County, served in the Revolutionary War, all from eastern NC.

his name was reported by the committee and Mr. Sheppard not properly acted on. The convention adjourned to meet another day when J.J. Perkins withdrew. The convention declared neither regularly nominated and then went into a nomination, which resulted in the selection of B.W. Brown. Mr. Sheppard insisted that he was regularly nominated at the former convention and went before the people claiming to be the regular nominee. He was supported by several leading Democrats and by the solid vote of the Republican party, and was elected by 99 majority after a campaign unexampled in its exciting activity and thorough organization on both sides.

Had he lived another twelve months he would have completed his twentieth year in the most important public office within the gift of the people of his county. On October 30, 1881, he died after an illness of a few weeks.

Allen Hal Turnage was born near Farmville, Pitt County, NC, on January 3, 1891, the son of William J. and Ora (Smith) Turnage. He graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1912, was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps on November 17, 1913, and rose to a four-star general during his 35 years of service. He served in both World Wars, and retired in 1948.

In the early years of his career, he served in Haiti (1915-1918) and with the 5th Marine Brigade in France as a Major (1918-1919). He later served in China, Nicaragna, and the Dominican Republic and again in Haiti.

As a Brigadier General, he was in command of the Marine Base, New River, NC, from July to November 1942. On December 1, 1942, he joined the newly formed 3rd Marine Division as assistant commander, and became division commander on Guadalcanal in September, 1943. He led the division (about 25,000 officers and men) in the landing and attack at Empress Augusta Bay, Bougainville, in 1943, and in the recapture of Guam in 1944.

For his service on Bougainville and Guam he won the Navy's highest medal, the Navy Cross and the Distinguished Service Medal. He also received the Legion of Merit, the Presidential Unit Citation, Navy Unit Commendation, Haitian Distinguished Service Medal, Nicaraguan Medal of Distinction with Diploma, and the Dominican Order of Military Merit, Class 2, with white Insignia.

After two years with the 3rd Marine Division, he was assigned to Marine Corps Headquarters as director of personnel, and later, as assistant commandant. His final assignment prior to his retirement on January 1, 1948, was as commanding general, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific.

General Turnage was married July 21, 1920 to Mrs. Hannah Carr (Pyke) Torrey, widow of Capt. Henry Torrey, USMC, a close personal friend of General Turnage. A story is told that at their wedding they did not get any of their wedding cake. After hearing that tricks were going to be played on them after the marriage, they ducked out the back door and left on their honeymoon without any cake. It wasn't until 1962 during their 42nd wedding anniversary that they were presented with a wedding cake.

The Turnages lived in a large two story brick home near the heart of Alexandria, Virginia. They were fond of Boston Terriers and were ardent football fans. Their friends knew there would be no answer to the doorbell while a game was on especially if the UNC Tarheels or Navy were playing.

General Turnage is remembered to have said "I hope and pray that Americans may return to the years of our youth - those prior to World War I. No great national or international problems arose then that couldn't be handled quickly. But since that time we have had one crisis after another, both domestic and international, and today it is hard to tell which is the most serious for all of us. Most of all I hope that Hannah and I will live long enough to see a return to a peaceful coexistence and way of life for all mankind. But in view of our age and current conditions throughout the world, I fear I am a bit optimistic."

General Allen Turnage died at Bethesda Naval Hospital in September, 1971, and he was buried at Arlington Memorial Cemetery, Washington, D.C.

BENJAMIN OTTO TURNAGE, JR. was born in Farmville, North Carolina November 2, 1913, the son of Benjamin Otto and Lillian (Whitfield) Turnage. He attended public school in Farmville followed by one year at Oak Ridge Military Institute, from which he graduated in 1931. In 1932 he entered the U.S. Military Academy and graduated June 12, 1936, when he was commissioned a second lieutenant of infantry. His first assignment was at Fort Moultrie, S.C., with the 8th Infantry. In May, 1938, he joined the 14th Infantry at Fort Davis, Canal Zone, serving as a rifle company officer and regimental communications officer.

Returning to the United States in 1940, he served at Fort Benning, Ga., with a medium tank division. In July of that year he joined the 24th Infantry, 8th Division, at Fort Jackson, S.C. After serving as assistant operations and training officer of the 34th Infantry and a company commander of a rifle company of that regiment, he became an assistant operations and training officer of the 8th Division.

In December, 1941, he accompanied the 34th Regiment to Hawaii and the southwest Pacific area, where he remained until February,

1944, serving as company commander, battalion executive officer and battalion commander.

In February, 1944, he was assigned to Headquarters, 6th U.S. Army, as an assistant operations and training staff officer. He participated with the headquarters in New Guinea, Leyte, Mindoro and Luzon campaigns and the initial months of the occupation of Japan.

After returning to the U.S. in December, 1945, he was assigned to Headquarters Army Ground Forces in Washington, D.C. In July, 1948, the General was assigned as a member of the staff and faculty of the Infantry School, Ft. Benning, Ga., and in 1951 he attended the Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, Penn.

Moving to Korea in 1952, General Turnage served with the 8th Army Headquarters as Chief of the Operations and Training Section.

In the fall of 1956 he attended the Advanced Management Program at the School of Business Administration, Harvard University, and the following year he graduated from the Italian Language Course at the U.S. Naval Intelligence School, Anacostia, Maryland.

In July, 1957, General Turnage was assigned as Chief of the Army Section, U.S. Military Assistance Advisory Group, in Rome, Italy, where he served for three years.

In September, 1960, he was assigned to the office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C., where since November, 1960, he served as Deputy Director of Combat Developments.

In July, 1962, he became Deputy Director, Policy, Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Later that year he became Chief of the Regional Division.

In 1965, Brigadier General Benjamin O. Turnage, Jr., was appointed Major General, after being nominated for the promotion by President L.B. Johnson.

General Turnage's awards and decorations included the Silver Star, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, General Staff Identification Badge and Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, and numerous secondary medals from WWII and Korea.

General Turnage married to the former Adelaide O'Neill of Charleston, S.C., and had two sons, Lt. John O. Turnage and Benjamin W. Turnage.

J. RAYMOND TURNAGE. One of Pitt County's most prominent citizens and foremost business men is J. Raymond Turnage, president of the First National Bank of Ayden, North Carolina, whose many additional important interests have made his name well known throughout this section. He belongs to an old and substantial family of this state, the founder of which came from Scotland in Colonial times.

J.R. Turnage was born at Ormondsville, Greene County, North Carolina, August 3, 1882, eldest son of Elias and Laura (Ormond) Turnage, and grandson of Elias Turnage. The grandfather was born on his father's estate near Farmville in Pitt County, where his entire life was passed and his death occurred in 1856. For many years he had been an extensive planter and slaveholder, and stood high in public regard as a citizen.

Elias Turnage, father of J.R., was born in February, 1850, on his father's plantation in Pitt County, which is the site of the present thriving city of Farmville. He was but six years old when his father died, but grew up in the old neighborhood and was one of the earliest merchants in the rapidly growing village. In 1878 he removed to Ormondsville, and for thirty years was the leading merchant there, but

when he retired from business, in 1908, he came to Ayden and here his life closed in February, 1915. To some extent he was active in democratic politics, although never an officeholder, and was a consistent member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, from boyhood. In Masonry he was a member and a past master of Hookerton Lodge, A.F. and A.M.

At Ormondsville, North Carolina, Elias Turnage married Miss Laura Ormond, who was born there in March, 1858, a member of one of the early and prominent families of that section. Mrs. Turnage still resides at Ayden, where she has a wide acquaintance and is highly esteemed. Of his parents' family of seven children, J.R. was the second born, the others being Olga, who is the wife of Will M. Edwards, a merchant at Ayden; Lucy T., who resides with her mother, and is the widow of David F. Crowell, formerly a leaf tobacco dealer at Richmond, Virginia; Roy L., who is associated with his older brother in business at Ayden; Lloyd E., who is also associated with his brother J.R. in business at Ayden, and is a veteran of the World war, with thirteen months of honorable military service to his credit; Leslie E., who died at Ayden in 1919; and Jennie, who died at Ayden in 1924, the wife of Kenneth A. Pittman, attorney at law at Ayden.

J. Raymond Turnage attended the public schools of Ormondsville in boyhood, but completed his high school course in the Trinity Park School at Durham, North Carolina, from which he was graduated in the class of 1900. He then entered Trinity College, where he remained a student in the academic department until 1902. In that year he returned to Ormondsville and assisted in his father's store for two years, and from that time until the present, has been prominently identified with mercantile interests at Ayden, for one year being additionally engaged as a cotton buyer for Alexander Sprunt & Son at Wilmington, North Carolina.

As a merchant Mr. Turnage has built up one of the most extensive mercantile enterprises in Pitt County, operating under the firm name of Turnage Bros. Company, conducting a modern department store that would do credit to a much larger city than Ayden. Mr. Turnage owns his commodious store and office building, of brick construction and modern in equipments, which is situated on the corner of Lee and Third Streets, in the heart of the business district. He owns a large amount of other valuable real estate at Ayden, included in which is his beautiful home at West Haven, which is one of the handsomest private residences in Pitt County, while his farm lands in Pitt, Greene and Lenoir counties aggregate hundreds of acres.

The organization of the First National Bank of Ayden, which Mr. Turnage accomplished in 1915, and of which he has been president ever since, is another example of his business foresight and sound commercial instance. Amply financed and ably directed according to his careful, conservative policies, this financial institution has brought many practical benefits and much prestige to Ayden, and has been a stable, strengthening force all through this section.

At Kinston, North Carolina, in January, 1908, Mr. Turnage married Miss Eva Moseley, daughter of Edward T. and Addie (Hodges) Moseley, the latter of whom is deceased. The father of Mrs. Turnage is a substantial farmer now residing at Kinston. She is a graduate of the State Normal College at Goldsboro, and is active in both church and social matters, taking an intelligent interest in general affairs and

cultural progress that concern the welfare of the community. Mr. and Mrs. Turnage have three children: Adelaide Moseley, Jesse R., Jr., and Mary Francis. The elder daughter, who was graduated from the Ayden High School, is a student at Greensboro College for Women. Mr. Turnage and his family are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, at Ayden, in which he has been chairman of the Board of Stewards for the past eight years.

In political life as well as business Mr. Turnage has long been an Active and important factor, not only in democratic circles but also as non-partisan, for his name carries with it public confidence equally in business, civic or personal relationships. For ten years he served as a member of the City Council, for the past decade he has been a member of the Board of Education of the Ayden School District, and since its organization in 1919 has been secretary of the Pitt County Highway Commission, and greatly interested in the good roads movement. During the World war he served for three years as a member of the Exemption Board of Pitt County, was a member of the Speakers' Bureau, and was chairman of the three Red Cross drives in this county, in the meanwhile unofficially setting an example of patriotism that is not forgotten.

In Masonry Mr. Turnage has reached the thirty-second degree and is a Shriner. He belongs to Ayden Lodge No. 498, A.F. and A.M.; Greenville Chapter No. 50, R.A.M.; New Bern Consistory No. 3, in the Valley of New Bern, thirty second degree; and Sudan Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S. at New Bern. He belongs also to Eureka Lodge No. 167, Knights of Pythias, at Ayden, and to commercial and other business organizations, and at present is serving in his second year as a member of the Board of Trustees of the North Carolina State College at Raleigh. Joshua Eugene Mewborn was the first Extension Agent for Greene County, was a County Commissioner (1927 - 1932) and served as the Greene County Clerk of Court (1933 - 1958). He was on the Board of Directors of the Pitt-Greene Electric Co-op and was an Elder at Mewborn Primitive Baptist Church, which was established in 1827.





Turnage selected to lead VA

WASHINGTON — President Reagan turned to a retired major general and veteran of two wars to take command of the Veterans Administration, the government's largest independent agency.

Thomas K. Turnage. 62, the taciturn director of the Selective Service System, yesterday was chosen to run the \$27 billion-a-year agency, subject to Senate confirmation.

Like most VA administrators, Turnage is a combat veteran. He served as an infantry officer in World War II, joined the National Guard in California in 1949 and was recalled to active duty in 1950 and sent to Korea.

During the late 1960s and early 1970s, when Mr. Reagan was governor of California, Turnage was deputy adjutant general of the state's Army National Guard. He returned to active duty again in 1979 and worked in the Pentagon's reserves affairs office.

Turnage has directed the Selective Service System since October 1981, maintaining a low profile while heading an agency whose job is to ensure that 18-year-old men register. There is no draft, but the names and addresses of young men are kept for use in the event a call-up is needed.

Turnage came under fire early in his tenure when Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., accused him of ignoring significant opposition to registration. Hatfield said he was disturbed by Turnage's "attempt to portray opponents of registration and the draft as an insignificant force in American society." At that time an estimated onequarter of the nation's 18-year-olds hadn't registered. Last week, Turnage said 97 percent of men 18 through 25 had signed up.

Barry Lynn, a lawyer who frequently opposed Turnage on draft registration issues, describes him as unbending and tough-minded — and not always willing to debate his critics.

"I found that he just did not want to discuss the merits of his program with critics because he was so convinced that he was right," said Lynn, legislative counsel for the American Civil Liberties Union and former head of an anti-registration coalition.

"He's one of the few people who ended up so disliking me he wouldn't shake my hand," Lynn said.

Turnage did not return a reporter's telephone calls.

If confirmed by the Senate, Turnage will become the third VA chief of the Reagan administration.

He follows Harry N. Walters, a former West Point football player who was highly regarded by the American Legion and other powerful organizations representing veterans. Walters was the first VA chief who did not serve in combat.

Under Turnage, the Selective Service System has used Social Security files, drivers' license registration records and college loan application lists to track down those who have not registered.

"The policy of the system is registration, not prosecution," Turnage said.

Word of Turnage's nomination met with surprise by some close to the VA. Officials at some of the service organizations and the veterans' committees in Congress said they had had little dealing with Turnage, and some Vietnam veterans' advocates said they had urged the White House to name one of their own. Turnage to succeed O'Keefe as S.D. District Immigration Service chief

James B. Turnage Jr., 49, who began his government career as a border patrolman, has been named director of the Immigration and Naturalization Service for the San Diego District.


Turnage is expected to arrive here Oct. 9 to take over his new post, succeeding James O'Keefe, who has been transferred to the INS regional office in San Pedro, where he is serving as a regional commissioner for management.

O'Keefe served as district director here for seven years.

Turnage spent several weeks here recently to familiarize himself with the San Diego office, waiting for confirmation of his appointment by the Department of Justice. He was in Seattle yesterday, preparing to move his family here.

Turnage, who has been a government employee for 27 years, served as district director of the Seattle INS office for the last five years. Beginning his career as a border patrolman, he served on both the southern and northern borders.

From 1964 through 1974 he served

as an immigration inspector and examiner at Detroit, Washington, D.C., and in Bermuda.

He was transferred to INS headquarters in Washington in 1974, placed in charge of the office responsible for liaison with Congress on legislation on behalf of individuals seeking immigration benefits not available under general law.

Later, he was involved in the planning and direction of national programs of detention and deportation of aliens.

This refers to your excellent editorial of Feb. 14, entitled "Inured to madness," concerning the Los Angeles City Council rescinding its November sanctuary resolution and the sanctuary movement generally.

I feel you have characterized such activities correctly as being more concerned with opposition to U.S. policy on Central America than any humanitarian goals. I would also like to comment on claims by local sanctuary-movement activists reported in the Feb. 17 article, "Sanctuary movement seen growing in San Diego area."

In the Feb. 17 article, church activists claim the sanctuary movement has gone underground in San Diego. Why is there a need to go underground and then ensure it is publicized in the media? Because support is, in fact, waning for the movement. It is running out of steam, and they are using a new twist in an attempt to gain additional support for the sparse following of political liberals now in the fold.

In this vein, there were repeated references to the La Jolla Quakers' support of the sanctuary movement, but I feel your readers should be aware that the La Jolla Presbyterian Church is presently considering a petition by its Men's Club to formally *protest* the Presbyterian General Assembly's support of the movement.

Deborah Taylor, of the Inter-Faith Task Force on Central America, would like the general public to believe that the movement has difficulty growing in this area only because of the large number of military and law-enforcement personnel.

Sounds like whistling in the dark to me. In reality, the movement simply lacks credibility because they use an emotional issue in an attempt to persuade upstanding church members to

violate immigration laws. Yet, the overwhelming majority of churches and their members preach and obey the laws of God and man. You do not have to be a police officer or a member of the military to know the difference between right and wrong.

Ms. Taylor's statements seem to indicate that the majority of the general public is gullible, therefore making them easy prey. The gullible are the minority who have aligned themselves with the movement without knowing the true ideology of the movement — opposing U.S. policy in Central America.

A few facts, not innuendoes, about the sanctuary movement and Central America:

- The United States does grant asylum to *true* political refugees, and El Salvador ranks fourth in total

numbers granted asylum - after Iran, Nicaragua, and Poland.

 Less than 250 churches in the United States support the movement. There are over 339,000 churches not participating.

— On Feb. 7, the City of Los Angeles reversed the Nov. 27 resolution declaring Los Angeles a "city of sanctuary."

 Other churches in San Diego have listened and chosen not to embrace the movement.

- 350,000 of the estimated 500,000 El Salvadorans illegally in this country came here prior to 1979 when the civil war began.

 The United Nations sponsors "Safe-Haven Camps" in El Salvador, Honduras, Mexico and Costa Rica for true political refugees.

- 61 percent of the El Salvadorans

apprehended illegally in the United States elect to return voluntarily to El Salvador without requesting asylum.

— The American Civil Liberties Union completed a one-year study of 22,000 names of deportees returned to El Salvador in an attempt to show that deportees were returning to their deaths. Not one name could be linked to death by either side in the civil struggle.

 Amnesty International, conducting the same type of study over a two-year period, could only link one name to a death, that in 1981 during a robbery.

A recent article published by The Rev. John Neuhaus, director of the Rockford Institute's center on Religion and Society, sees the sanctuary movement in a most appropriate light when he states, "The danger and sadness of the sanctuary movement is that it politically exploits the compassion of thousands of church people, debases the meaning of religious freedom, imperils the well-being of hundreds of thousands of aliens already in this country, precludes serious debate about a more just immigration policy, and invites a popular backlash against America's tradition of generosity to refugees."

I challenge church authorities considering involvement in the sanctuary movement to ensure that their congregations are presented with all the facts. Then, and only then, will law-abiding churchgoers be able to make an informed decision. I welcome the opportunity to address any church or similar organization to assist them in this decision-making process.

ART. 6. This Conference may, at each regular meeting, elect as many Boards or Standing Committees as may be necessary in carrying out its benevolent purposes. 

NOAH HENRY TURNAGE

Noah Henry Turnage, son of Joseph and Mancy Turnage was born in Greene County, N. C., February 24th, 1866 and died after about five months' illness of that dreaded disease, cancer, at his home in Greene County, N. C., January 21, 1924, aged 57 years, ten months and 21 days. He was married to Miss Mary Ava Gray May 8th. 1889. They had twelve children of whom two are dead, one infant and Ruth Maybelle, and the following ten are living, four sons. Reetho Gold, Joseph Lester, John Roland and Henry Bailey and six daughters, Emma Gertrude Mewborn, Nancy Virginia, Edith Estelle, Nellie Gray. Lucy Inez and Annie Ava. He manifested a desire to be baptized, professed a hope in Christ and at his request several of the brethren and sisters of Mewborn's Church met at his mill Wednesday after the second Sunday in December 1923 and he was received and baptized in the fellowship of the Primitive Baptist church at Mewborn's the second day by Elder W. B. Kearney and myself. He being so feeble it was thought best for both of us to assist. He was never able to attend a meeting after being baptized. He was one of the most lovable men I ever knew. Kind to everything that he came in contact with. We can't begin to mention all the good traits that he possessed.

As a neighbor there was none like him. I knew him as a father, a brother, a friend and a neighbor. I feel that I have lost one of the best earthly friends that I will ever have. The most agreeable man I ever saw. I don't ever remember being in his presence that I didn't feel better by it. Have heard others say all that I have said about him. His home and surroundings were kept cleaner than any one's I ever knew, and as for confusion he could not bear it. His whole plea in his last days to his children and others was that they live peacefully together and one with another. He visited us often in sickness and in health and our entire family will not soon forget that pleasant face and the interest that he seemed to have in all of us and our neighbors. The people of our community both white and colored witnesses with me that there's but few such men lived in this day and age. While we cannot hope to see his face any more nor expect him to return unto us, I hope we feel thankful of the hope the Lord has blessed us with that in time He will take us too, where as we hope, there'll be no sorrow, sickness nor pain, where all these things shall be done away.

He was in many respects the most devoted and useful man in our entire community. He was a farmer all his life and one of the best. He had the confidence and esteem of all who knew him. His entire family, friends and several good trained nurses and physicians from time to time in his illness kindly ministered to him doing all in their power to relieve and comfort him. After burial services conducted by Elder T. B. Lancaster, his body was interred in the Mewborn Cemetery in the presence of many sorrowing relatives and friends January 22, 1924. At one time while in a Richmond hospital he told me, since he had been afflicted he had been made to feel and see the helplessness of man and that he was entirely dependent upon the Lord for all things both spiritual and natural, and that he wanted to be baptized but felt to be unworthy. I told him that the Lord was worthy and He alone was able to make us worthy and that His people were of His power. He said that he had felt poor and afflicted and willing in the day and had seen all these things. He like Ruth of old, not only manifested a desire to live and die with us, but to be buried also.

MEET YOUR PUPIL

I was born in Greene County, North Carolina, August 20, 1914, and grew up in a Christian farm home on the Atlantic Coastal Plains of the state. My father, deceased since September, 1979, was a farmer and a miller who grew grain and ground it into meal and flour for family use during my childhood. This farm has remained in the family for more than four generations. No doubt this background has contributed greatly to my fondness for the land itself and the open countryside. There I can observe the beauties and wonders of nature that have always fascinated me.

For years, I have been concerned about the conservation of our natural resources. Growing up on the family farm helped me to see this need and the benefits to come from good farming practices. Since the land was slightly hilly, contour plowing has been necessary to prevent soil erosion. The practice of planting winter cover crops has been kept up for years which helps enrich the soil and provide food for wildlife.

Some of my nature-related hobbies are gardening, bird watching and tree identification. My interest in vegetable and flower gardening has been keen for years. April is planting time in Carolina and mine is mostly done, which means there will be plenty of fresh vegetables to enjoy daily and some to freeze.

Bird watching suggests bird feeders and houses. My newest attractions have been blue bird houses and hummingbird feeders outside my kitchen window. What a thrill to watch the tiny, darting birds hover near the feeder for a drink during the warm Spring and hot Summer days.

As a young child, I walked to a country, three-teacher school about three miles away for the first six grades. Many fond memories of my early years remind me of how my mother, a teacher, created in me a great desire for learning. My thirst for gaining knowledge has never ceased, and I wanted to share it with others. By the time I had reached sixth grade, I knew that I wanted to become a teacher. So I was never faced with the problem of choosing a vocation.

After high school, I entered East Carolina College, Greenville, North Carolina, and majored in Elementary Education for two years and received a "B" teaching certificate. The after effects of the Great Depression only allowed me to get two years of teacher training at the time. After three years of teaching fourth grade, marriage, and the birth of a son, the economic situation had changed with World War II raging in Europe.

I returned to classroom teaching and began working toward completing my bachelor's degree. By the time I earned it, our second son was three years old. I continued my education with the approval and backing of my family. Five years later, I was awarded my Masters in Elementary Education from my alma mater, by attending night classes and summer sessions. How busy and full those years were! The challenge of the classroom offered a wide range of experiences for me by teaching all the elementary grades from kindergarten through eighth grade, except first and second, at one time or another. My preference was fifth grade for it was this age child that interested me most. I recall a problem that often presented itself - that of locating suitable stories for children to help them build good character traits such as dependability, honesty, truthfulness, obedience and promptness. This lack sparked a desire for writing that I hope to achieve, at least in some small way during my retirement.

Being reared in a Christian home, I feel that I have had the benefits of the highest and finest quality experiences life has to offer. My mother, still living at age 86, read Bible stories and the Bible to us seven children and taught us proper respect for God. I accepted Christ as my Saviour at age fourteen and have been growing in his love and grace since. During most of my adult life, I have taught a Sunday school class in my church regularly, having taught one class about twentyfive years.

My husband of twenty-eight years, now deceased, helped in establishing a Christian home where our two sons grew up in a wholesome atmosphere. A special interest in their mental and spiritual growth and development sent me looking for the best books available for them. They were surrounded with many colorful books and were read to, by both parents, almost daily during their early years beginning with their first one. <u>Hurlbut's Story of the Bible</u>, Revised Edition, was our stand-by for devotional reading and is well worn from frequent use. What greater reward can parents have than to watch the maturity of their own children take place?

My first year of retirement after thirty-eight years in Greene County Schools finds me constructively busy. I saw "The Institute of Children's Literature" ad in Today's Education about a year ago and thought I might want to try this. So, you see what I'm doing!

Traveling is another special interest of mine. I hope to get some in during the next few years. My first planned trip takes place next month with departure from New York to Munich, Germany; Egypt and the Holy Land on May 26 for fifteen days. I'm looking forward to that date.




Some other hobbies of mine are reading, listening to inspirational and semi-classical music, crocheting, painting, flower arranging, crewel embroidery and other stitchery.
