Turnage Deeds and Land Records

The Duplin County deed records were lost many decades ago. Prior to their destruction, officials of adjoining Sampson County, which was created from part of Duplin County, had copied the deed records for their own public records. Duplin County officials then later copied the copies which were on file in the Sampson County courthouse at Clinton.

The deed records at the Duplin County courthouse are therefore copies of copies and not the original court records.

The Court awarded 171 pds. 16 shill. 9 pence to GEORGE HOOPER, exr. for ARCHIBALD McLAIN dec'd, merchant of Wilmington & 104 pds. 17 shill. to CHARLES JURKES (?), merchant of Wilmington in 2 separate judgments against THOMAS NORMAN & JOHN HILL, guardians of the heirs of FELIX KENAN. These actions began at the June 1788 & June 1789 Terms of Court. Subsequent court judgment in Sept 1792 resulted in the 1673A, granted formerly to FELIX KENAN by virtue of sundry patents & deeds, being sold to sd. NORMAN. Wit: SAML. R. JOCELYN. Apr. Ct. 1795.


