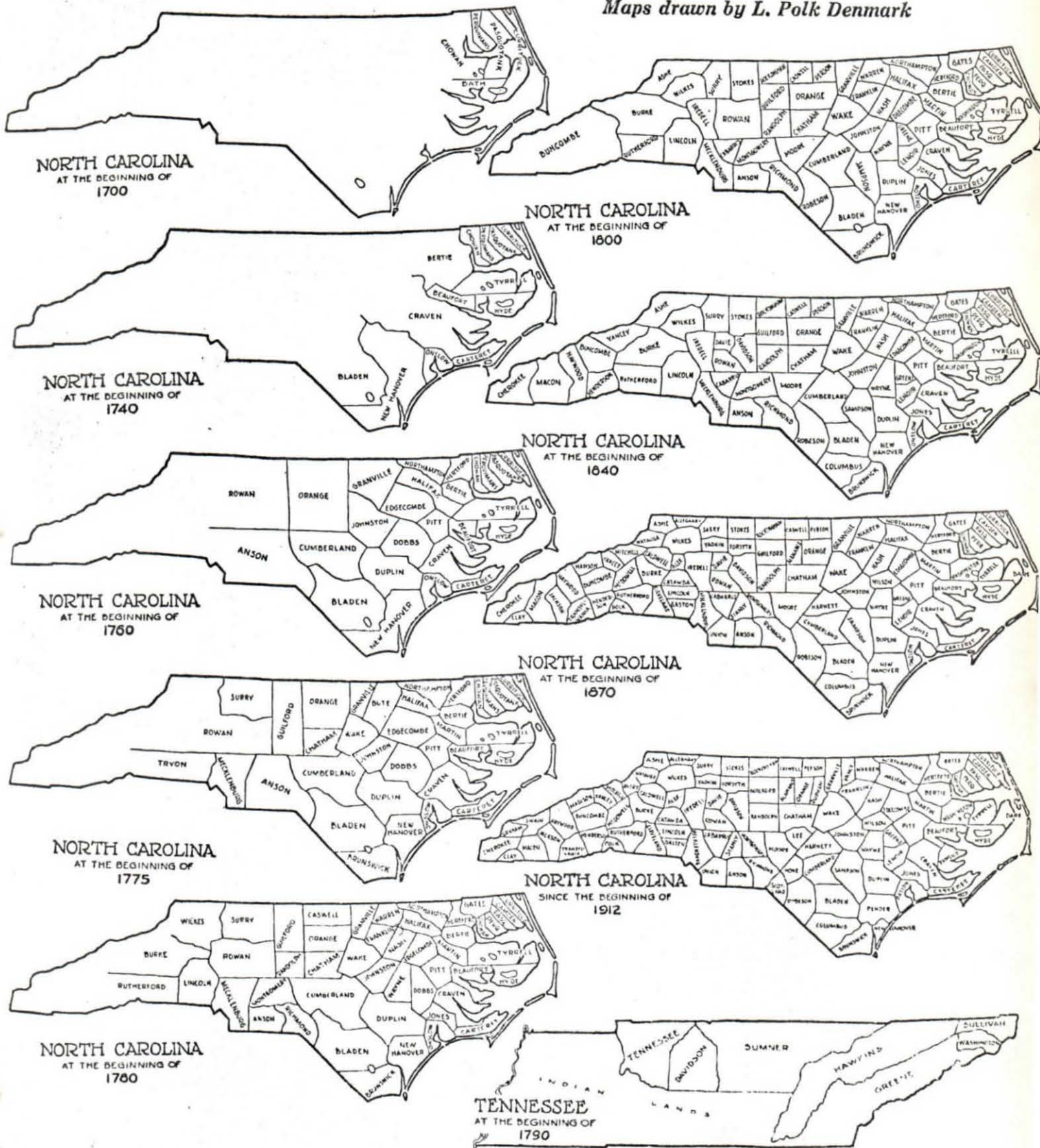

1. Did this Lowry family move to Wilkes County, Georgia? A Judge Lowry was witness to a will there in 1786, with Benj. Baird and his wife, formerly of Anson and Montgomery Cos.

3. Benjamin Baird, or his wife, Micha (Miche, Mickey), was apparently related to or connected with John Smith, Sandhill, in some way. They had two land grants together and one with David Smith, son of John Smith, Sandhill. These three also jointly owned a saw mill and grist mill in 1773 on Little River, in the corner of a tract bought by David Smith from Saml. Swearingen. Was Benj. Baird son-in-law, or brother-in-law of John Smith, Sandhill? Although entry-taker in Montgomery County from its organization, he also served in the Revolution. Auld and Chiles, commissioners for Anson, Montgomery and Richmond Cos. in the Salisbury Dist. paid his certificate for \$139.10 over to the entry-taker of lands for him in July 1782. N. C. Rev. Acc'ts, Vol. XII, p. 27-4. Dept. of Arch. and Hist., Raleigh. After the Rev. he moved to Wilkes Co., Ga. where he died before Feb. 1794 when his inventory was returned to the County Ct. His wife, Micha, was one of the purchasers at the sale of the perishable estate in Sept. 1794. He was taxed in 1785 with 2 polls, 2 slaves and 500 acres in Wilkes County, and, with wife, Mickey, and Judge Lowry, witnessed the will of William Rasbury, Apr. 7, 1786. GLASGOW COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Glasgow was created as a county in 1791 when old Dobbs County was split in two to form Glasgow County and Lenoir County.

The county was named for a local resident who later was discovered to have participated in a major fraud involving payments to veterans of the Revolutionary War.

As a result of this scandal, the people of Glasgow County renamed their county as Greene County.

For records on Glasgow County after 1798, see Greene County.

(Most Glasgow County records have been lost. This county was created from part of Dobbs County in 1791. In 1799, the name was changed to Greene County. Among the North Carolina land grants issued in this county were:

GREENE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Greene County Courthouse

Greene County was created in 1791 when old Dobbs County was divided into three different counties.

The county was originally named Glasgow County after a local resident. When it was discovered the namesake had been a part of a major fraud, the people renamed Glasgow County as Greene County in 1799.

The records of old Dobbs County were destroyed when the courthouse at Kinston, NC was destroyed by fire in 1878.

The Greene County courthouse burned in 1876. All county records for Greene and Glasgow County were destroyed in this fire, with only a few exceptions.

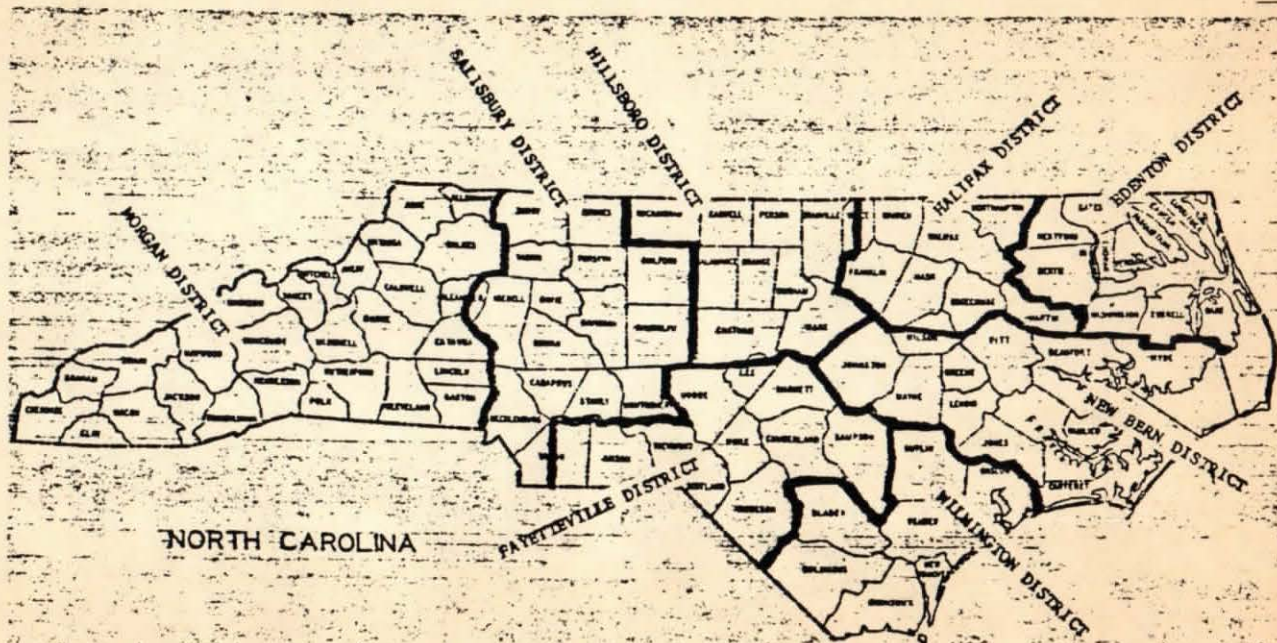


Fig. 11- MAP SHOWING THE APPROXIMATE BOUNDARIES OF THE EIGHT JUDICIAL DISTRICTS IN NORTH CAROLINA IN 1790

The County and War

It seems by the list of the officials of Dobbs County that there were a few families running the local government in nearly all seats from the sheriff to the governor and the people at our end of the county, which later became Greene, became very tired of this monopoly of local government, so when they put up a protest they became unruly. Check the list of the local officials and take a good look. In efforts to correct this situation a bill was introduced in the General Assembly in December 1791 to divide Dobbs County into new counties with courts, prisons, and stocks in each. An opponent of the bill, General William Graham, declared it was the first time he had ever heard of destroying a government to establish law and order. Therefore, Dobbs County disappeared from our history.

As stated on previous pages, I will list the names known that saw duty in the Revolutionary War, with the State Militia, Continental Army or otherwise. As stated before, the list, no doubt, many will be left out, but to leave out the ones that I have a record of, I would have done them a great injustice. The North Carolina State Law in 1777 was passed that all free white males 16 to 50 were subject to militia service, so it would seem that most at that time did serve. Also it is hard to pick out the soldiers that lived in what was to become Greene County, as they were all listed from the county of Dobbs.

Lenoir County was created in 1791 when old Dobbs County was split in two to form Lenoir County and Glasgow County (Glasgow changed its name in 1799 to Greene County).

The records of old Dobbs County became part of the records of Lenoir County. All the Dobbs County and Lenoir County records were destroyed when the county courthouse burned in 1878.

No county records exist prior to this year except a few state records preserved by the State Archives and a few other state agencies at Raleigh.
